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Introduction

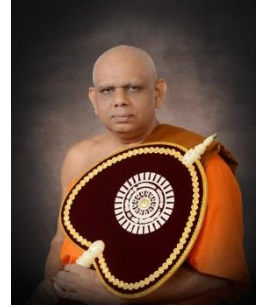
The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka which had been established by the Parliamentary Act No.74 of 1981 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka was inaugurated at No.214, Bauddhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 07 on the 22nd April 1982. The major objectives in the establishment of this University are to publizise the Buddhist Doctrine, to promote the Buddhist and Pali Studies in Sri Lanka as well as in foreign countries and to facilitate researches in the respective fields.

The above Act has been amended by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka (Amendment) Act No. 37 of 1995. With the enforcement of the said Amendments, the local affiliated Institutions have been invalidated and the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka had undergone the process of re-structuring to comply with the structure found in the other National Universities of Sri Lanka and it has been established in Homagama in the Month of June while the External Examinations and Post Graduate Studies Centre of the University has been established at the premises located in Bauddhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 7. The Academic Premises with hostels has been established at Pitipana, Homagama and the Administration Centre (Head Office) has been established at No. 37, Moragahahena Road, Pitipana on 12.08.2010. The required initiatives have already been taken for transforming the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka in to an internationally recognized University well equipped with necessary resources. The University has obtained the membership of the Association of Commonwealth Universities and it is an Associated Member of the Committee of Vice Chancellors and Directors (C.V.C.D.) of the University System of the Country.



The Message of the Venerable Mahopadyaya Thero

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka, which is currently operated under the purview of the Ministry of Higher Education is a University functions by the Act No. 74 of 1981 and the Act (Amendment) No. 37 of 1995. The University which inherits a history of 30 years and has achieved national and international recognition, holds the membership of the Association of Commonwealth Universities and the Committee of Vice Chancellors and Directors (C.V.C.D.) of the University System of the Country. Academic and Research activities of the internal students of the University are performed in the premises located at Gurulugomi Mawatha, Pitipana, Homagama while External Examination Activities are carried out at the Post Graduate and External Examination Studies Centre situated in Bauddhaloka Mawatha Colombo 07. The foremost Objective of this University in terms of the Act is to produce disciplined scholars who are appropriate to promote the Studies of Pali and Buddhist Philosophy in Sri Lanka as well as in foreign countries.



Academic as well as research activities of the Buddhist and Pali University are carried out by 8 Departments of Study under the two Faculties of Buddhist Studies and Language Studies. I am pleased to mention that the availability of Senior Professors, Professors, Senior Lecturers and Graduates with Doctorate Degrees among the Academic Staff which is approximately 50 members has contributed positively for uplifting the quality of the academic and research activities.

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka which is perfected with the aforementioned Human Resources as well as fully equipped library facilities, Lecture hall facilities with modern accessories and residential facilities provides a proper academic and research environment. Thereby, a large number of local and foreign lay and clergy students register with the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka annually with the objective of following the Courses.

The Courses of the University has been designed with the objective of producing scholars who benefit the modern world with knowledge and discipline through broadening the wisdom in subjects and practical usage. Likewise, the attention has been focussed on introducing novel courses by identifying new requirements. Further, we have drawn our attention to produce scholars useful to the world through functioning with the identification of the national and international requirements by updating the prevailing Courses. 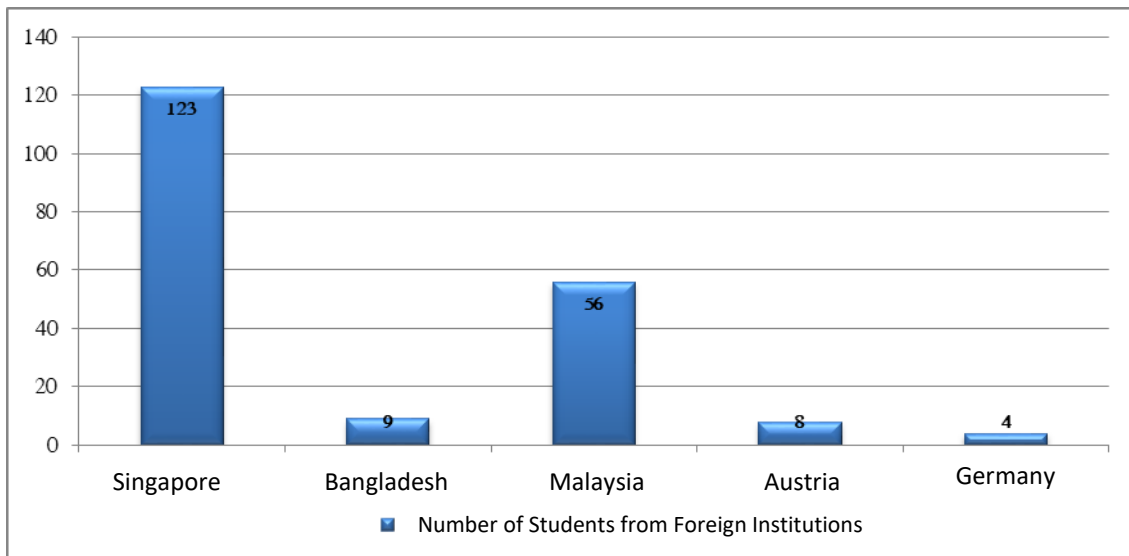

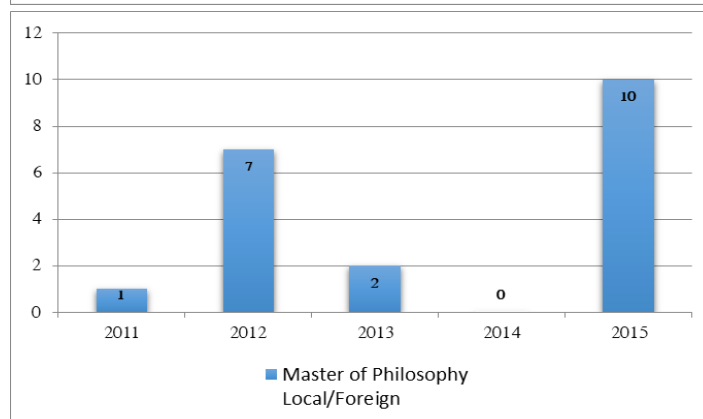

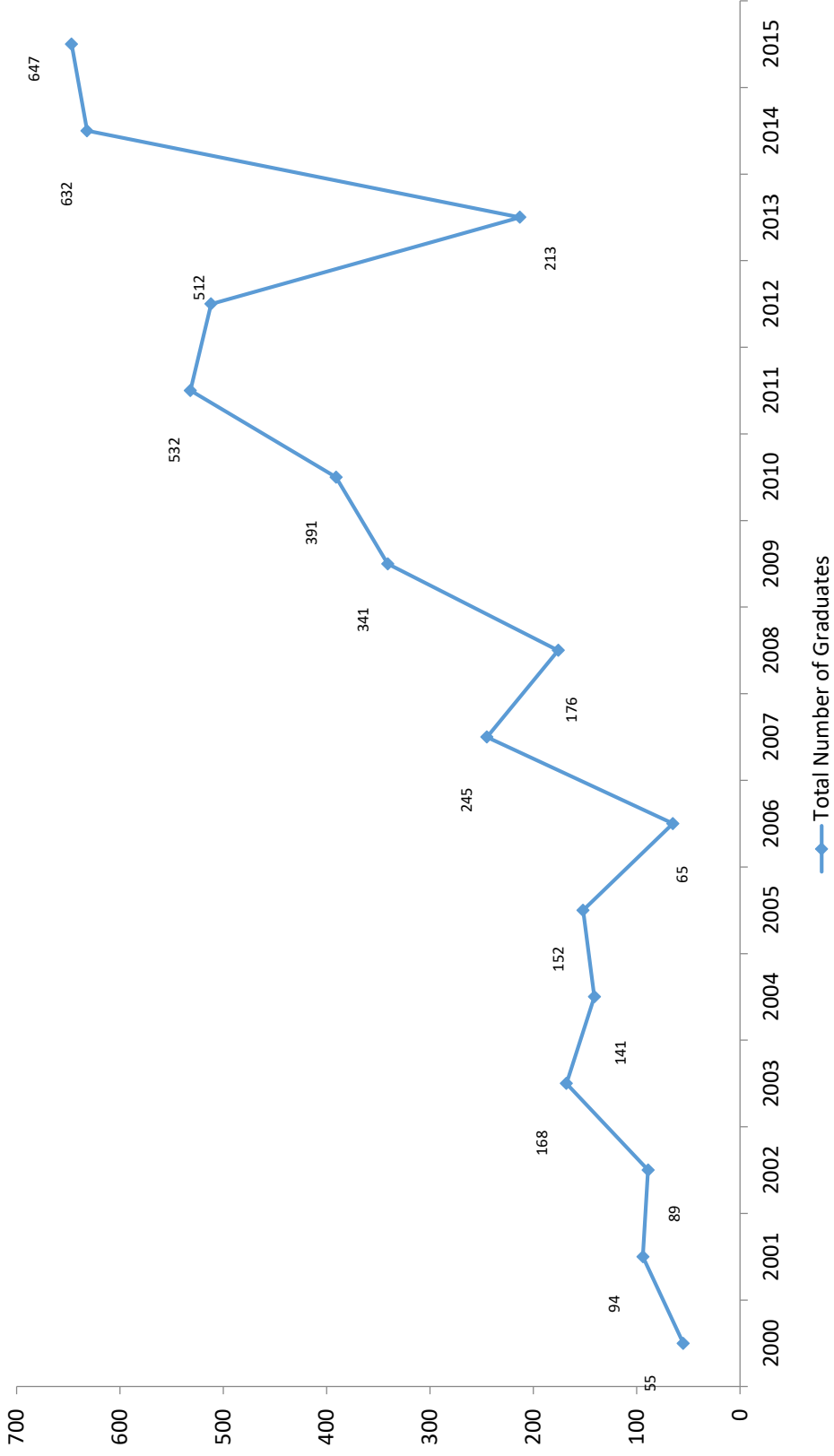

Number of Graduates Produced During the Period of Year 2000 to 2015.



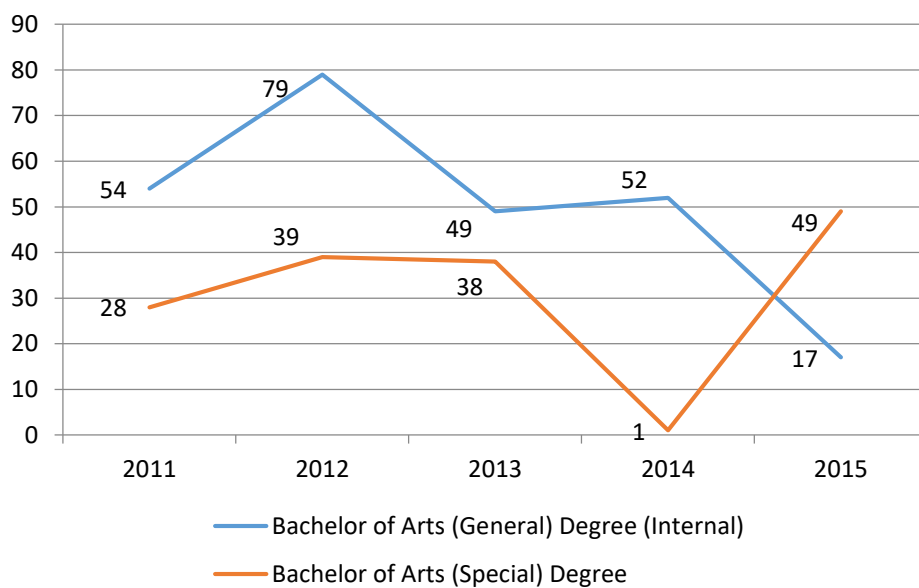

The initial phases of the following Programmes were implemented in the year 2015 with the objective of uplifting the knowledge, attitudes and skills by improving the qualitiveness of the Scholars, who have been employed by the University for conducting the Academic activities of the University and for safeguarding the Buddhist Order and for promoting the attitudes of the Buddhist Monks and for developing a new approach within the Academic Staff on the Academic and Research Activities.

01. "Project on protection and promotion of attitudes of Sri Lankan Bhikkhu Society – (2013 to 2015)" is being carried out by the Academic Staff of the University in the Faculty of Buddhist Studies.

This is a field research project on the protection, attitude promotion and uplifting Piriven Education of Bhikkhu society. Collection of data separately from Kruthyadhikari (Chief Incumbant), Parivenadhipathi, Parivenacharya and clergy students through questionnaires, interviews and identification of issues confronted by the Bhikkhu, Bhikkhu education as well as Buddhist Order and submission of a series of proposals including the measures that have to be adopted in resolving such issues is the foremost objective of the Research Project.



The Research Task of collecting data was finalized through a sample made by number of Piriven selected from all the districts to represent the whole set of Pirivena. The assistance of the academic staff and past scholars of the University was obtained for this Research activity. The final Research Report is being compiled by a Committee that comprises of external Resource Personnel and Academic Staff of the University.

02. International Conference on Religious Tolerance and Harmony 2015 was conducted by the Department of Religious Studies and Comparative Philosophy of the University on 22.04.2015 and 23.04.2015. 03. Pre-Survey related to the Valley of Maduruoya

A surface Investigating Survey was conducted on 13,14 and 15th of March 2015 with the participation of lecturers and students of the Department of Archaeological Studies of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka with the objective of socializing the significance of Archaeological sites associated with the Valley of Maduruoya that are not famous. In the Survey, Kandegama kanda, Hennanigala, Kunchanamale and Thoppigala areas were surveyed specially and they were able to discover a stone inscription that had not been published earlier. It was able to make a significant discovery from this inscription belongs to the 6-7 Century AD that the ancient name of the Thoppigala, the place of worship had been proved to be “Kalatha Maha Vehera”. This Inscription has already been published by the Department of Archaeological Studies of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka.

04. One day Academic Seminar on Youth contribution to Social Harmony was conducted in the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka on 22.10.2015 with the guidance and cooperation of the Academic Staff of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka and with the fullest support and contribution of the entire student community and the Non-Academic Staff.

05. Project for Spiritually Strengthening the Rural Community

03 phases of the “**Project for Spiritually Strengthening the Rural Community**” were implemented by focussing the following areas in relation to the Directives mentioned in 7.2 of the Action Plan for the Year 2015. Many Programmes on Buddhist Counselling were conducted in the areas. 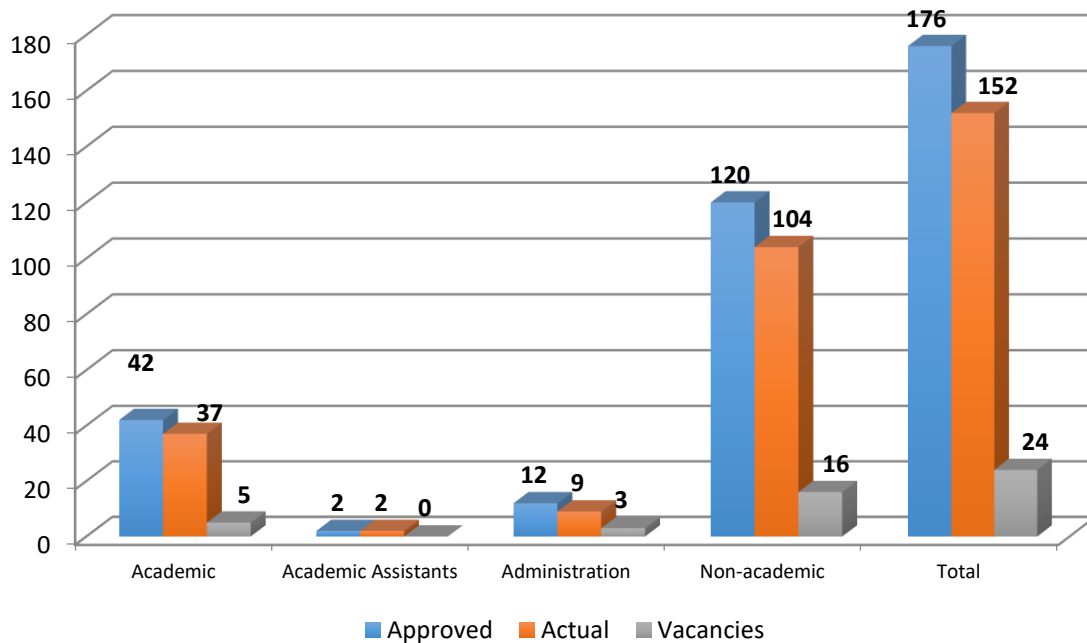

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka has been established by the Act No.74 of 1981 and the Act has been amended by the Act (Amendment) No. 37 of 1995. The Study Unit of the University is situated in Pitipana North, Gurulugomi Mawatha, Homagama while its Administration building is located at No. 37 of Moragahahena Road, Pitipana, Homagama. Post Graduate and External Examination Unit of the University is situated at No.214 of Bauddhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 07.

1.1.2 Fundamental Activities and the Nature of the Operations**Vision**

To be the foremost and most excellent Buddhist University in the World.

Statement of Mission

Bestowing the World with Versatile Buddhist Missionaries and Scholars capable of promoting and fostering in Sri Lanka as well as in Foreign Countries the Philosophy of Life, which is perspicuous by the Dhamma of the Lord-Buddha and well-disciplined with the influence of the Buddhist Doctrine, Pali Language and the Wisdom achieved on the related Subjects and perfected with different Skills.

This University has been established under the Ministry of Higher Education and is mainly operated with the Provisions of the Government.

The University where local lay and clergy students as well as foreign clergy students are following Degree Courses is comprised of two Faculties, namely, Buddhist Studies Faculty and Language Studies faculty.

Students are consistently encouraged by the University to follow the Post Graduate Degrees and to conduct Researches.

1.1.3 Basis of Preparation**(a) Statement of Conformity**

The Final Financial Statements have been prepared as per the Sri Lanka Public Service Accounting Standards (SLPSAS) and the Principles adopted in the previous years, the Financial Act No. 38 of 1971 and the Establishments Code have been made applicable wherever necessary.

In addition, the following Circulars which have been made applicable to the University by the Administration Council of the University from time to time have been also used for the purpose of recording Accounts.



- * Public Administration Circulars and Public Financial Regulations.
- * Circulars issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC).

(c) **Buildings under the Turn key Project of the University**

The contract of Rs.512 Million for the construction of the Building complex of the University has been awarded to the Central Engineering Consultancy Bureau (C.E.C.B) on the Turn key Basis under the approval of the Cabinet of Ministers and the final payments for those buildings have not yet been settled.

1.2.3 Evaluation of Stocks.

- (1) The stock in the stores have been evaluated on the Purchased Price and the stocks are issued on First In First Out (FIFO) Basis.
- (11) The relevant allocations have been made in the year 2012 for the slow-moving items to the value of Rs.71,594 and for Nonmoving items to the value of Rs.12,635.

1.2.4 Investments

- i. One Fixed Deposit and one Savings Account have been commenced for Fixed and Savings Accounts that existed separately for each Scholarship and Prize Funds which already existed for Scholarships and Prizes obtained by the University on the approval of the Administration Council. Scholarships are offered annually, based on the interest accrued in relation to the opening Deposit.
- ii. The amount of money allocated for the Medical Assistance Funds will be deposited in Fixed Deposit Accounts and the interest earned from it annually will be credited to the Medical Assistance Funds.

1.3 Liabilities and Allocations

- (a) The Retirement Gratuity Fund No. 12 of 1983 has been made applicable to the University and provisions have been allocated from the year 2011 for the payment of Service Gratuities.

1.4 Contingency Liabilities

The details regarding the cases filed against the University by the employees and external parties of the Buddhist and Pali University have been mentioned below. It is not possible to come into a definite conclusion regarding the value of the monetary liabilities since final judgments in relation to these cases have not yet been received. However, it has been assumed that it is possible to have financial liabilities in this regard.

1.5. Development of Skills.

- (a) 'Bhikkhu Promotion Programme' was implemented in 2012 for Buddhist monks in admitting students to the Buddhist and Pali University. The expenditure incurred in that respect is considered as Capital Expenditure and recorded under Non- Current Expenditure. It has been decided to write off such Capital expenses within (with effect from 2013) 3 years since the students admitted to the University leave the University within 3 years.
- (b) Expenditure incurred for the development of skills of the Non – academic and Academic Staffs are considered as Capital Expenditure and recorded in Accounts under Skills Development It has been decided to write off the Capital expenditure in four years when it is not in conformity with the contract.

1.7 Paying Taxes

The university has been exempted from paying income tax under the section 7(b) of the Inland Revenue Act No.10 of 2006.

1.8 Identification of Sources of Income

The income has been calculated on the accrued basis when recorded in accounts.

1.9 Expenditure

Expenditure incurred for bursaries, Mahapola and legal Expenditure have been recorded in Accounts on Monetary Basis.

Other expenses have been identified on timely basis and recorded in Accounts.

Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2015 in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971.

The audit of financial statements of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2015 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2015 and the statement of financial performance, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Section 13(1) of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 and Section 38 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act, No. 74 of 1981. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act appear in this report. A detailed Report in terms of Section 13(7)(a) of the Finance Act will be issued to the Reverend Mahopadhyaya in due course.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for Financial Statements

The management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements whether due to fraud or error.



1.3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards consistent with International Auditing Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAI 1000-1810). Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. Subsections (3) and (4) of the Section 13 of the Finance Act, No.38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the Audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.



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2. Financial Statements

2.1 Opinion

The financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2015 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Accounting Deficiencies

Even though the amount of depreciation calculated for the year under review for the vehicles received on Government grants had been shown as Rs.7,239,500 in notes to accounts, the depreciation of the year under review had been over stated by Rs.160,000 due to the same amount had been shown as Rs.7,399,500 under the property, plants and equipment. Similarly, the accumulated depreciation relating to the preceding years had been shown as Rs.20,416,667 according to the relevant notes, it had been shown as Rs.20,643,333 under property, plants and equipment. Therefore, it was observed that the accumulated depreciations had been overstated by Rs.226,666.

2.3 Accounts Receivable and Payable

The following observations are made.

- (a) Action had not been taken to bring to the income or settle the retention money totalling Rs.10,446,752 recognized for more than five years even by the year under review.
- (b) An advance amounting to Rs.233,174 had been given in the year 2010 for the construction of a volley ball playground to the Central Engineering and Consultancy



Bureau and the work had not been commenced even by the year under review. However, action had not been taken to recover the relevant advances .

2.4 Non-compliance with Laws Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

The following non- compliances with laws, rules, regulations and management decisions were observed.

Even though the ad-hoc sub-imprests granted to officers should be settled within 10 days immediately after the completion of the purpose for which it was obtained , a sum of Rs.462,108 granted in 10 instances to the officers had not been settled and the settlement of the imprests of Rs.221,600 obtained in 5 instances had been delayed the periods ranging from 12-54 days.

(iv) Financial Regulation 756

Reports had not been furnished by carrying out a survey in respect of library books in terms of Financial Regulations.

(c) Treasury Circular No.IAS/2002/02 dated 28 November 2002

A Register on Computers and Computer Accessories had not been maintained.

3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented, the operations of the University for the year ended 31 December 2015 had resulted in a deficit of Rs.36,960,804 as compared with the corresponding deficit of Rs.2,626,061 for the preceding year, thus indicating a deterioration of Rs.34,334,743 in the financial result as compared with the preceding year. Increase in salaries and other allowances by Rs.44,104,317 had mainly attributed to this deterioration.

In the analysis of financial results of the year under review and the 04 preceding years, a deficit increased continuously since the year 2011 to the year 2015. However, the contribution of the University from the year 2011 to the year 2015 had shown a plus value



in considering personal emoluments ,government taxes and depreciation on non-current assets and it had increased continuously and become Rs.192,617,441 at the end of the year under review.

4. Operating Review

4.1 Performance

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka had been established by the Act No.74 of 1981 with the main objectives of the training of savants in the Buddhist Doctrine and Discipline for the purpose of the dissemination of Buddhism and nurturing of Buddhist missionary activities in Sri Lanka and abroad, the promotion of the study of the Pali Language,Buddhist Culture and Buddhist Philosophy in Sri Lanka and abroad,and the enhancement of those studies as befitting the modern world trends,the training of the student monks and the lay male student to teach Buddhism and Pali in the Pirivena,Schools and in similar institutions .

The following observations are made in respect of achieving the above objectives.

- (a) Four hundred and forty four General Degrees, 11 Postgraduate Diplomas and 124 Postgraduate Degrees had been awarded in the preceding year by the External Examination Division of the University. Even though only 121 Postgraduate Degrees and 5 Postgraduate Diplomas had been awarded in the year under review , no any General Degrees had been awarded.
- (b) It was observed that, the awarding of External Degrees had been at a very high level as compared with the awarding of internal Degrees for which more resources of the University had been utilized. Accordingly,1800 external Degrees had been awarded within 5 preceding years, whereas the number of Internal Degrees awarded during this period had limited to 368.



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- (c) The total recurrent expenditure incurred for 350 students for studies in the year under review amounted to Rs.289,950,228 and the total recurrent expenditure incurred for 359 students for the preceding year amounted to Rs,235,642.269. Accordingly, the cost per student in the year under review and the preceding year were Rs.828,429 and Rs.656,385 respectively and it had increased by 26 per cent.

4.2 Management Activities

The following observations are made.

- (a) The Projects relating to Rs.1,367,386 lapsed for the period from 3 to 6 years after advances had been granted had not been implemented and no action had been taken against officers responsible to recover the advances or performance bonds or to take legal actions .
- (b) Even though in terms of Sub-section 26.1 of Chapter iii of the Establishments Code of the University Grant Commission and Higher Education Institutions , it had been stated that the practice of obtaining visiting lecturers from other Institutions should be discouraged , 30 visiting lecturers had been employed exceeding 44 approved posts of lecturers of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka and a sum of Rs.5,694,623 had been paid to them as allowances during the year under review.

4.3 Operating Activities

The following observations are made.

- (a) The balance of the Scholarships and Rewards Fund Investment Savings Account as at 31 December 2015 amounted to Rs.2,424,883 and that money had been operated as a savings deposit instead being invested in fixed deposits.
- (b) The "Geun" Buddhist Research and Publication Fund established for the purpose of providing funds limited only for the researches of the Buddhist studies and Pali



Language had not been utilized after the year 2006 to achieve the intended objectives and a sum of Rs.264,084 had been spent for the activities extraneous to the Fund during the year under review .Accordingly, the balance remained in the Fund as at the end of the year under review was Rs. 1,870,138.

4 Underutilization of Funds

The utilization of Government Capital Grants provided for the capital improvement of the University had been at a very weak level. Capital Grants of Rs.22 million provided in the preceding years had not been utilized and only Rs.60 million had been utilized out of Rs.99.2 million received in the year under review. Accordingly, the total capital grants under- utilized at the end of the year under review had exceeded by Rs.61 million .

5 Idle and Underutilized Assets

The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though accommodations could be supplied for 208 students in the building constructed for the purpose of supplying residential facilities for foreign students, accommodations had been supplied only for 30 foreign students and 25 laic students at the end of the year under review. It was observed that the building constructed by spending Rs.220 million had been underutilized.
- (b) Twenty items of goods valued at Rs.242,960 were remained idle in the stores for a period ranging from 2 years to 12 years.

Accountability and Good Governance

.1 Procurement Plan

Even though ,estimations of Rs. 4,671,162 had been made for the purchase of 201 items of goods including furniture , equipment according to the Procurement Plan of the University,



682 items of goods had been purchased at a cost of Rs.21,691,676 in the year under review. Accordingly, it was observed that the Procurement Plan had been prepared without being identified the needs of the Institute and without paying attention on necessary forecasts.

5.2 Budgetary Control

Savings ranging from 16 per cent to 291 per cent were observed under 11 items between the budgeted recurrent expenditure of the year under review as compared with the actual expenditure, thus indicating that the budget had not been made use of as an effective instrument of management control.

6. Systems and Controls

Weaknesses in systems and controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the attention of the Reverend Mahopadyaya of the Buddhist and Pali University from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of following areas of control.
