# **1. Introduction**

According to the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka the subject relating to handloom textile industry has been vested with the Provincial Councils. In this context, the Department of Textile Industries is entrusted with the matters involving policy decision on the said subject, centralized activities and provision of services towards the development of the industry by way of coordination with the textile industry sector of the Provincial Councils.

## 1.1 Vision

Gearing up producers to manufacture creative and competitive textiles in the sphere of handloom textile industry in a manner befitting the indigenous identity and the culture as well as in a manner that can upsurge the behavior of the local and international market.

# **1.2** Mission

Formulation of policies in relation to the development of the handloom textile industry within the policy framework of the Government and creation of quantitative and qualitative improvement in the handloom textile industry sector through the required guidance, provision of necessary services and facilities, and monitoring and coordination with a view to setting such policies in motion.

- Formulation of policies in relation to the development of the handloom textile industry
- Provision of product development oriented programs
  - Entrepreneurial development programs.
  - Design creation programs
  - Training of Trainers programs
- Training of instructors and personnel required for the development of the handloom textile industry sector

- Provision of appropriate projects, opportunities of the self-employment and support services and organization of programs with a view to expanding the handloom textile industry

- Experimental research and conservation work required for the uplift of the handloom textile industry

#### 3. <u>Annual Performance</u>

3.1 Construction of buildings and work involving improvements

- Repairs to buildings at the textile schools in Matale, Bandarawela, Thalawa, Boyagane,
  Watapuluwa, Kottala, Getambe and Katubedda
- Work involving improvements in the project office in Anuradhapura
- Work involving the rearangement of the Head Office of the Department of Textile Industries

#### 3.2 Activities related to Power Loom Sector

Work in relation to power loom institutions that were owned by the Department and sold out to the private sector and matters involving the claims of pension and compensation of those officers who lost their jobs after being employed in such institutions are handled by this section.

The compensation payment activities in terms of the Cabinet Decision bearing No.12/0865515/004-1 dated 12.07.2012 for awarding compensation for employees who had served less than 10 years in the power loom enterprises owned by the Department of Textiles Industries which were handed over to the private sector in 1980/81/82 have been finalized.

The total number of employees to whom compensation was paid as at 31.12.2016 was 3910 and a sum amounting to Rs. 355 million has been disbursed as compensation.

#### 3.3 Training Projects of Textile Industries

• Training of pupils following recruitments to Textile Industry Training Schools.

Thirteen Training Schools of Textile Industry which are in operation under the Department of Textile Industries provide training through a six month basic training course in Textile Industry and, in addition, a final certificate training course in Textile Industry spanning over a period of 13 months.

Accordingly, 161 pupils were recruited for the academic year 2015/2016 (02.07.2015 – 31.07.2016) whilst the number of pupils recruited in July 2016 for the academic year 2016/2017 (04.07.2016 – 31.07.2017) was 157.

• Training of pupils following recruitments to the Textile Industry Designs Training Schools

There are two Textile Industry Designs Training Schools in operation under the Department of Textile Industry. During the academic year 2016, pupils numbering 10 to Designs Training School in Getambe and pupils numbering 10 to Designs Training School in Katubedda gained entry for following respective studies in the month of January 2016. Those who have passed the final textile industry certificate examination of the Department of Textile Industries qulify themselves for gaining entry into the Designs Training Course.

#### 4 Handloom Textile Industry Trade Promotion Programme

#### • Handloom Textile Industry Trade Fair

With the objective of popularizing handloom textiles among people and creating more demand for such products by way of making available opportunities for markets for the local handloom textile manufacturers, this fair was held at the precincts of the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall (BMICH) from **25-27** of March 2016.



• National Handloom Textile Competition, Exhibition and Awards Ceremony

The annually featured national handloom textile competition, exhibition and the awards ceremony was held from 09 to 11 December 2016 at the precincts of the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall (BMICH) with a view to harness the talents of those involved in the textile industry according them the due appreciation of their skills with requisite motivation in order that they could contribute in creating locally manufactured textile aimed at both national and international markets underpinning improvement of the qualitative aspect of the handloom textile industry.

















#### 5 In Service Training Programme

Under this activity, organization and implementation of training programmes necessary for the advancement of the textile industry encompassing an array of personnel in the calibre of textile industry managers, enterprisers and instructors is undertaken.

36 training programmes for 974 trainees were conducted during the year 2016 with the objective of enhancing the productivity of the Departmental members of the staff and those personnel employed in the field of handloom textile industry involving the provincial public, cooperative and private sectors.

(This activity constituted 26 training programmes relating to the field of textile industry, 02 skill development programmes and 03 personality development programmes and 05 field study tours for the pupils of the textile schools.)



#### 6 <u>Conduct of Examinations</u>

#### Activities relating to examinations on textile industry training courses

Examinations of the Final and Preliminary Certificate Courses in Textile Industry were held from 26 to 28 July 2016. These examinations were attended by 127 textile school pupils and 57 external candidates whilst two textile school pupils and twelve external candidates did not take part in them.

**08.** With the objective of expanding the handloom textile industry as a more effective way of livelihood in mind, handloom textile industry projects were initiated for 41 beneficiaries in the areas of Wariyapola, Wellawa, Talalla and Palamunei in the districts of Kurunegala, Matara and Batticaloa.

**09.** The Department of Textile Industries, under the provisions of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, initiated several handloom textile industry projects covering various districts of the Island.

After giving training on the handloom textile industry for a period of six months to the beneficiaries selected from the areas of Hingurakgoda, Lunugamwehera, Dehiattakandiya, Valachchnei, Welikanda and Marandamuna and the areas of Bopitiya, Rambukkana (Udugama), Mahapallegama and Tholangamuwa in the district of Kegalle followed by the granting of sets of handloom, basic implements and tools aswell as raw material necessary for the commencement of the industry free of charge, measures were taken to induct the beneficiaries who received training into the industry. Apart from this exercise, sets of handloom necessary for the local manufacturers engaged in the industry were also distributed free of charge among them with a view to having them kept encouraged.



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10 Yarns and other equipment necessary for the textile industry training schools, project centres and handloom textile industry projects maintained under the Department of Textile Industries and furnitue and fittings required by the Head Office were purchased during the year.

11 The English Language Training Course conducted for the pupils following the textile industry training course in the textile industry training schools got under way in the year 2016 as well.

12 An official uniform was designed for the officers of the Department taking part in the National Handloom Textile Industry Exhibition 2016.

13 Two sets of uniform each were provided to all pupils studying in the Textile Industry Training Schools during the year 2016 as well.

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14 The order placed by the Department of Buddhist Affairs for Daham School sarees numbering 68,000 distributed free of charge by the Government among Daham School teachers in respect of the year 2016 was handed over as requested by way of completing the job through the manufacturers registered in the Department of Textile Industries.
